► FACT SHEET



<p>► LOCATION</p>	<p>► Giraffe Manor is located on 140 acres of indigenous forest in Nairobi's Langata suburb. The hotel is easily accessible from both the International Airport as well as Wilson Airport (from where most safari air connections depart).</p>	
<p>► ACCOMMODATION</p>	<p>► The atmosphere at Giraffe Manor is that of an intimate house party, with managers Marianne and Rudy hosting meals and taking care of every need.</p> <p>► Accommodation at Giraffe Manor is both varied and stylish. The Manor was built in the 1930's and some of its interior decor reflects the fashion of the day, including the 1930s art deco bathroom complete with black and white floor to ceiling tiling. These features make the property unique, and form part of its personality.</p> <p>There are six rooms, one of which is suitable for children. Room configurations are: Betty's Room – double. Daisy's Room – twin. Jock's Room – twin. Marlon's Room – double or twin. Lynn's Room – double or twin. Karen Blixen's Room (annex) – double / twin / family (sleeps up to 5 pax with extra bed in room).</p>	
<p>► WEDDINGS & HONEYMOONS</p>	<p>► Special events can be arranged at Giraffe Manor, and involve the whole property being taken over. We recommend that for weddings, Giraffe Manor is booked exclusively for a minimum of three nights.</p>	
<p>► CHILDREN</p>	<p>► Children of all ages are welcome at Giraffe Manor.</p>	
<p>► CLIMATE</p>	<p>► Climate in Nairobi is temperate. Nairobi is at 5500ft above sea level, making it cool at night and warm during the day.</p>	
<p>► HISTORY</p>	<p>► Giraffe Manor was built in 1932 by David Duncan, and modeled on a Scottish hunting lodge. It was used as a private residence and became the property of Jock & Betty Leslie-Melville in 1974, a few years after Kenya's Independence. At this time the Rothschild Giraffe were under serious threat, so Jock & Betty made it their mission to provide a sanctuary for this beautiful creature, and created what is now AFEW (African Fund for Endangered Wildlife) at Giraffe Manor, which was their home. Since then, Initially, it was a family home; however since 1984 Giraffe Manor has been open as a hotel, primarily to raise funds for AFEW, with each guest of the Giraffe Manor contributing to the running of AFEW as part of the standard rate.</p>	
<p>► ACCESS</p>	<p>► By road: Road transfers from Nairobi's International Airport can be arranged, and a sightseeing vehicle is available.</p>
